School Uniform Policy

This policy has been written to outline the details and aims of our school uniform.

Finedon Mulso Junior School believes it is important that our school uniform is strictly adhered to because it:

- Gives our children a sense of belonging and pride in our school
- Reduces the risk of social pressures and pride in our school
- Reinforces our school's positive behaviour systems
- Supports the teaching and learning within our school

Finedon Mulso School Uniform:

- Black or grey trousers, skirt or school uniform shorts (not football shorts or three quarter length trousers or track suit bottoms)
- White or blue polo shirt or white or grey collared shirt
- Blue sweatshirt or cardigan with the school's logo (no hoodies)
- During the summer, girls can wear blue and white dresses
- Dark coloured socks with trousers. White socks or black tights can be worn with dresses or skirts
- Low heeled black shoes or sandals
- Shorts and skirts should be an appropriate length
- One or a pair of small simple stud earrings and one watch to be worn only
- Neat and tidy hairstyles, long hair to be tied back

The children are not allowed to:

- Wear trainers
- Wear jeans, leggings, tracksuit bottoms (including three quarter length trousers) or combat style trousers
- Come to school with dyed or streaked hair
- Wear jewellery other than that stated above, that includes no hooped earrings or jewelled earrings
- Wear inappropriate footwear including trainers, open toe sandals, flip flops or sling back shoes. Boots should only be worn underneath trousers
- Wear make up of any kind including nail varnish and temporary transfers
- Attend school with hair styles which are deemed by staff as inappropriate – this includes shaved patterns in the hair

If a child attends school without the correct uniform a note will be expected from parents to explain why. The school will assist any parents who have a genuine problem in acquiring articles of school uniform.
