



Sports Premium Statement 2016- 2017

In September 2016, Somerville Primary School received additional funds of £10,500 to support the development of Physical Education and Sport in school (Sport Premium). This money is in addition to the curriculum funding for PE and Sport from the main school budget.

To provide for the areas of PE, School Sport and Healthy Lifestyle, Somerville school will use the Premium for the following:
