<b>Reception</b>	<p>This week the children have worked very hard on our show 'Lights, Camel, Action!' and they are looking forward to showing you their hard work next week when we perform it to you all! The children have produced fantastic writing about the Little Red Hen which we have now finished, and they have also worked very hard on 2D shapes. Next week the children will be looking at 1/2 more and less in maths and in Literacy we will be looking more closely at the Christmas story and having a go at writing some parts of it. Please could we also ask for any spare white t-shirts, black leggings, tights etc. as we are running short of spare clothes – thank you! We hope you have a lovely weekend!</p> <p><b>(Phonics taught so far: s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d,g,o,c,k,ck,e,u,r,h,b,f,l Tricky Words: the, was, my, me).</b></p>
<b>Year 1:</b>	<p>This week we have been very busy with our play practice 'Lights, Camel, Action!' We are looking forward to showing you all next week. This week 'Buddy' our class elf has arrived, the children are very excited to find out what he has been up to in our classroom. Next week we will be writing letters for him to take to Father Christmas.</p> <p>This week we have started working on subtraction in Maths and looking at how to solve problems. We have been practising drawing the number sentence and crossing off to solve. I have sent some out as homework for the children to practice. In RE we have made advent promises and looked at the Christmas story. Have a lovely weekend.</p>
<b>Year 2:</b>	<p>We have another very busy week practicing our play ready for next week. The children have worked hard learning all their lines, songs and dances.</p> <p>Next week we are going to complete our science work looking at different food chains which we started this week. We are writing the Nativity story in RE and looking at the different people who visited baby Jesus. In maths we are going to complete our subtraction work renaming which I will send home next week for extra practice. We are writing lots of different instructions in Literacy and are going to try them out to see if they are correct. Have a great weekend and we look forward to seeing you all at our play.</p>
<b>Year 3:</b>	<p>We have had another busy week in school as we have started practising hymns and carols ready for our Carol Service on Thursday at 6pm. We hope you can all join us as this is always a lovely evening. Further details will be given next week including what time we would like the children to be back at school on the evening. In class, we have been looking at division – both grouping and sharing. Children have brought home their division fact cards for homework to practice and learn. In Literacy we have been learning about report writing and the features of these. Children have then been researching for information linked to our Science topic as the basis for writing a report next week.</p>
<b>Year 4:</b>	<p>We have been getting into the Christmas spirit this week! On Tuesday, we went along to Advent mass and all week we have been rehearsing for our church carol service. We hope that you will all be able join us for this next Thursday at 6pm. It will be a lovely evening and the children have been working hard on their singing! We've still found time to do some work though. In maths we have been looking at multiplying multiples of 100 and 3-digit numbers. The children have worked really well on this and are ready to move on to looking at division next week. In literacy we have completed our work on writing tales of fear and have begun looking at instruction writing by learning the text 'How to trap a dragon'. I hope you all have a lovely weekend!</p>
<b>Year 5:</b>	<p>Year 5 have been working hard this week and will continue with our work next week. We have started to practice for the KS2 Carol Service which is in Church on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December at 6pm. We will be having a dress rehearsal at 2pm, which you can come to if you are unable to attend in the evening. Thank you for your donations for our stall at last weeks Christmas Fair, we raised £112 towards our Lockerbie trip! We will be continuing our fund raising efforts on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> December by Carol Singing in Tesco with year 6 from 1pm – 3pm. Please come and support us if you possibly can and tell your family and friends that we will be there! Have a lovely weekend.</p>
<b>Year 6:</b>	<p>It might only be the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December, but preparations for Christmas are in full swing! On Tuesday we celebrated our Advent Mass in church. We have been rehearsing the nativity ready for our Carol service in Church next Thursday. All children who are wearing costumes need to be back at school for 5.30pm. Readers need to wear choir uniform, and should be in school for 5.45. We hope you will all be able to join us as we celebrate the Christmas story. Next Tuesday, Year 6 will be attending Mass at 9.00 and afterwards we will be providing refreshments for the parishioners. As usual, you are very welcome to join us. **What is happening during the last two weeks!**

**Week commencing 5<sup>th</sup> December:**

On Monday the school nursing team will be coming to give the Flu Vaccines to those children from years 1, 2 and 3 who returned their forms. Tuesday sees our Christmas celebrations begin! Year 6 will be going to Mass at 9am; they will be providing refreshments afterwards in the Columba Room for parishioners and those who have joined us for Mass. We would be grateful for any donations of cakes and biscuits from year 6 for this - please take these to the office on Tuesday morning. You are all very welcome to come and join us at Church. A group of year 5 & 6 children will be singing carols and Christmas songs in Tesco from 1pm – 3pm to raise money for their residential trips, please do support them if you possibly can. In the morning KS1 perform their nativity play for KS2 before performing it for parents at 6pm. There will also be other performances at 2pm and 6pm on Wednesday. Tickets have been sent home for these performances but any spares will be available from the office at 9am on Monday morning. On Thursday KS2 have their Carol Service in Church, there is a dress rehearsal at 2pm which you may go to if you are unable to attend the Service in the evening at 6pm. As always there will be raffles at all of the nativity plays and Carol Service, all monies raised helps towards the cost of costumes. Little Jimmy's Toddler Group have their Christmas party on Friday morning. Our school choir will be singing at the Blind Society Christmas Party in the afternoon. We will have our last assembly on Friday when VIP's, Certificates and Birthday Cakes will be given out.

### **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Our Breakfast Club runs every week day when we are at school from 8am and costs £1 per child per day, which is payable daily or weekly / termly in advance please. Children are able to choose from a wide range of cereals, drinks and toast. They can play games, read and socialise with the other 'breakfast clubbers' before going in to class or they can take the opportunity to do their homework. Breakfast club is open to children from any class. *(If your child does not usually come to breakfast club, please let our school office know that they will be coming - just so that our staff have an idea of how many children to expect. Thank you.)*

### **ILLNESS**

Please could we remind parents of the advice concerning sickness and diarrhoea. ***Please do not send your child in to school if they have been vomiting or had diarrhoea. They need to be kept at home for 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.*** Could you also remember to contact school to let us know that your child is off ill. ### **GIRLS UNIFORM**

Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.

### **BOYS UNIFORM**

Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks. All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

NO TRAINERS to be worn to school. Thank you.

### **PE KITS & EARRINGS**

**All children** should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform. **Please remove your child's earrings on PE days. And also on Swimming days.** Our school policy is that staff does not remove earrings for the children and that a plaster covering the earring is not sufficient.

Your child may not be allowed to take part in PE and other sports activities if they do not have the appropriate sports kit or they are wearing earrings which they cannot remove themselves. Thank you.
