




Evolution and Inheritance

- Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the earth millions of years ago
- Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents
- Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.

Micro-organisms

- Describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals
- Investigate the positive and negative role of micro-organisms in everyday life
- Give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics

- Examine daily lifestyles for different aspects of the community, *e.g. rich and poor, men and women* explore the legacy of the Victorian period in modern day Britain


