### **Impact of PE and Sport Premium 2015-2016**

The result of a recent Sports Questionnaire was a **58% increase** in sporting activities undertaken outside of school hours.

Fairfield School is now an official partner of Bury Football Club.

Children in Years 1 to 6 had access to 12 different sports during 2015/2016.
