In 2016 children at the end of KS 2 were assessed against the new, more challenging National Curriculum (2014) for the first time. End of KS 2 tests in Reading, Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling and teacher assessment in writing were introduced to assess the revised curriculum. Results are no longer reported as levels. Each pupil now receives his/her test results as a scaled score and teacher assessments based on the standards in the framework.

The floor target set by the DfES in 2016 was

- 65% of pupils meet expected standard in RWM or meet the sufficient progress scores in all 3 subjects which were:
 - minus 5 or better in reading and maths
 - minus 7 or better in writing.

In 2016 we met the floor target based on the progress measure. As a local authority moderator Mrs Hopkinson (Assistant Headteacher) internally moderated our standards in writing. Green shading indicates results above both LEA and National figures.
