

Sports Legacy Funding

Sports Legacy Funding was introduced in 2013 to provide enriched sporting activities and raise the standard of sports teaching. The information below provides a summary of expenditure of this at St Philip's Primary School, further information is available from the school office.

Summary Report on Sports Legacy Funding 2016/2017

Total Funding Received: £9,659

Nature of Expenditure: Breakfast Club (£2,500), Morning and After Lunch Sensory Circuits (£2,750), Travel Expenses (£300), Swimming Tuition (£1,650), Training courses for the PE Coordinator (additional time to lead the subject) (£500), Training for Midday Supervisors (£150) and additional resources to enrich the teaching of PE throughout the school (£2,800).

Impact of Funding: Children's fitness continues to rise across the school. Children across both KS1 and KS2 enjoy a broad range of sports teaching and competitive events and have greater access to tournaments. Most children in KS2 can swim. Many children who have fitness issues are targeted to ensure they start to have and understand what a balanced and healthy lifestyle is.

Legacy for leadership: Being a play leader is recognised by Secondary Schools and so children are able to continue to gain experience/awards, such as being Young Sports Leaders in Secondary School.

Links to Clubs: We provide children with information to access sports clubs in the local area and, therefore, long lasting sporting opportunities for them.
