Sports Funding Grant Spending and Intended Impact Information 2016-2017

It is for schools to decide how the Sports Grant Funding is spent. However, they are accountable for their use of this funding. From April 2013, schools are required to publish online information about how they have used the Sports Funding. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving the provision of Physical Education and School Sport, including healthy living.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs

The total amount of sports premium funding received by the Grange primary school in 2016-17 is £9000

Sports coaching We use a local coaching company to provide sports coaching across the school. Children in all our classes in 16-17 will receive high quality sports coaching for one lesson a week with their class teacher leading the other PE lesson each week.
