In maths, we have been looking at capacity and trying to use the correct words to describe how full or empty the containers were. We will be carrying on with this next week! Next week will be thinking more about the miracles that Jesus performed. The children have no reading books next week; instead I have sent home a sheet with 100 High Frequency words and the children should know some of these words. Please could you support us by having a look at which words your child can read (or even spell) and tick them off as you go! Please can everyone make sure that they have put their child's name clearly in all items of clothing as we are having a lot of confusion with missing jumpers – especially on PE days! Year 1	<p>What a wonderful week in Year One! We have had lots of fun learning our new story 'the three little pigs' we have created posters, questions and developed the story opener. I have been very impressed with all the writing this week. On Tuesday afternoon we had a lovely craft afternoon making stick houses. We enjoyed pretending to be the big bad wolf and blowing the sticks. In Maths we have finished positions and moved onto shape. We have been looking at 2d and 3d shapes in our classroom and their properties. We have enjoyed labelling the classroom. We will continue with this next week looking at pattern and grouping shapes in different ways. We will also begin to look at length and height. In RE we have been looking at baptism and special family celebrations. We had a lovely visit from one of governors this week, Mr Rodgers it was lots of fun sharing our work with you. Year 2	<p>This week we have been researching information about China. Next week we are going to write a non-chronological report to complete our topic. We are also going to create some descriptive poems. In maths we are completing our multiplication and division work. In RE we are looking at signs and symbols linked to Lent and how we prepare for Easter. Our science topic this term is Animals including Humans and we have been matching pictures of babies and older animals, seeing how some are similar and others like frogs and butterflies are different.</p> <p>Can I ask you to encourage the children to use our Athletics and Spellodrome programmes at home. Year 3	<p>We have had a good week in Year 3 this week. Children have enjoyed their measuring activities in Maths, especially finding out how far one kilometre is! Hopefully children have a better understanding of this now. In Literacy, we completed our final piece of story writing based on the warning tales that we have been studying. We have now started looking at a different type of writing – News Reports – based on a mysterious creature! Year 4	<p>Year 4 have had a busy week! In maths, we have been looking at adding fractions and the children got the hang of this really well. Next week, we will be looking at subtracting fractions as well solving word problems. In literacy, the children have been doing lots of good work on non-chronological reports ready to write their own next week. In our RE lessons, we have been looking at Jesus' teachings through the parables. We are now fully subscribed to the Spellodrome site which the children can access using their Athletics username and password. A list of new spellings will be put on regularly that relate to what we are focusing on in class. Please encourage the children to log on and have a go at the different games and activities. What's been happening? On Wednesday we were very happy to welcome the members of our school governing body who joined us for the day. They spent time in each of the classes and enjoyed having their lunch with the children in the school hall at dinner time!

What's happening this week? On Monday morning Year 6 and Reception Class will be having their height and weight checks. Miss Mullan will be having a meeting for year 4 parents at 3.30pm in her classroom. She will be telling you all about the forthcoming trip to Castlerigg so please do try to come along if you possibly can. On Wednesday afternoon year 5 and 6 will be going to The Beggars' Theatre to watch a production of 'The Saga Of Ernest'. We break up from school for our half term holiday at 3.15pm on Friday.

What's happening after half term? On Monday 27th January, year 5 will be going to St Bernard's Catholic High School to watch their performance of The Sound Of Music in the afternoon. On Tuesday morning KS1 will be sending some teams to compete in the gymnastics tournament at Millom School. Wednesday 1st March is Ash Wednesday, KS2 will be attending Mass in Church at 9.30am. KS1 will have their own service in school at 11am. Our Parents Evenings are on Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd March. On Thursday 2nd in the afternoon, year 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be going to The Beggars Theatre to watch a production of 'Jason and the Golden Fleece'. Please could we ask for a donation of £2 per child for this to help us offset the cost.

Swimming: The swimming pool is now open so the children from years 3&4 will be swimming on Wednesday's. Please be aware that Swimming is a curriculum subject and it is mandatory for all of the children to attend and so parents should always send swimming kit to school for their child. If your child is not able to go swimming please could parents send in a signed note in the morning.

Sunday Mass: We have started to attend Mass on Sunday mornings every other week; Children will be doing the readings and the offertory as well as joining in with the singing. Mrs Nicholas will be checking which children would like to and are able to attend beforehand so that readings can be given out in good time. It is lovely that the children have begun to attend Mass and it is nice that parents come along to support them too. It does mean a lot to our parish community to have the children at Mass so thank you for your support. The next date for the Children's Mass is **Sunday 12th February 2017**. We look forward to seeing you on Sunday ☺

Educational Welfare Officer: We now have a School Educational Welfare Officer, she is Mrs Sue Mallinson and she works for the Furness Catholic Schools, which we are part of. As you know we monitor our school attendance constantly and unfortunately lots of children are falling below our school target of 95%. We do understand that there may be legitimate reasons for the absence such as illness but we do have a duty to promote and pursue good attendance for all pupils. We will contact you to let you know if your child's attendance is between 90 – 95% and will monitor it more closely in the future. Parents of children whose attendance falls below 90% will receive letters from Mrs Mallinson inviting them to meet with her. We do have a legal responsibility to inform parents when their child's attendance drops below 90%, which is the threshold set by the local authority. Please do contact me if you wish to speak about your child's attendance.

Parents Evenings: Our Parents Evenings for the Spring Term will be on Wednesday 1st and Thursday 2nd March from 3.30pm – 6pm. Letters have been sent home today and we ask you to please complete and return the form by Wednesday 15th February. This will enable us to let you know the time of your appointment before half term. Thank you for your help with this.

Headlice: We appear to have a problem with headlice at the moment. Please could we ask you to check your child's head regularly – we recommend that you look once a week. There are various lotions available at the local chemists, and the pharmacists are always available for advice and recommendations.

Threadworms: There have been some instances of children having Threadworms. If you think your child has threadworms (your child may have a very itchy bottom at night and may be scratching more; and you can see them in their poo!) please visit the chemist who can give you some medication to treat your family. Please encourage your children to wash their hands after going to the toilet! Thank you.

Football Kits: Please can children who went on the Blackburn Trip return their football kits and tracksuits to school as soon as possible. If anyone has any of or school kits or VIP jumpers at home, please return them to school. Many Thanks.

GIRLS UNIFORM

Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper or cardigan with school logo. Black flat-heeled shoes (not trainers) or White socks or grey tights. Summer Uniform is pink school dress with white socks, white sandals may be worn.

BOYS UNIFORM

Grey trousers or Shorts. Blue polo shirt. Maroon jumper with school logo. Black shoes (not trainers) or sandals. Grey socks. All shoes worn to school should be sensible and appropriate for the weather.

NO TRAINERS to be worn to school. Thank you.

PE KIT

White top (with or without school logo). Black shorts. Black pumps.

PE KITS & EARRINGS

All children should have a PE kit and a pair of pumps in school at all times. Please check and ensure that your child has the correct uniform. Please remove your child's earrings on PE days. And also on Swimming days. Our school policy is that staff does not remove earrings for the children and that a plaster covering the earring is not sufficient.

Your child may not be allowed to take part in PE and other sports activities if they do not have the appropriate sports kit or they are wearing earrings which they cannot remove themselves. Thank you.
