3. Alteration description

A description of the proposed alteration and in the case of special school proposals, a description of the current special needs provision.

It is proposed to enlarge the premises of Rainham Village Primary in two phases, in order to provide teaching space for the expanded school and nursery:

Phase 1 (2017). Three new classroom spaces are to be created as an extension. Ancillary spaces formed as per requirements.

Phase 2 (2018). The Foundation Unit is formed, to provide for the three reception year classes and the expanded (30 to 45 FTE, 3 & 4 years old). The former nursery

will be remodelled into two new classrooms and the dilapidated demountable unit at the back of the site will be demolished. To support the expansion the school kitchen will be expanded and modernised. Ancillary spaces formed as per requirements.

A new solely pedestrian access is to be created off the Viking Way recreation ground, and provides a wide and safe footpath leading to and from the school premises across a stretch of the park. .

The existing permanent capacity of Rainham Village Primary is 420.
The proposed permanent capacity after the alteration will be 630.

The number of children currently admitted to Reception at Rainham Village primary school is 60; the proposed number from September 2017 will be 90.

Objectives

The objectives of the proposals.

The objective of the proposal is to provide much needed additional school places in the Rainham & South Hornchurch planning area by enlarging the premises of Rainham Village Primary School from September 2017 in response to an increasing demand for school places. In Havering we have seen an increase of over 45% in the number of births between calendar years 2002 and 2015. Therefore the Council must find ways to provide more primary school places for local families over the coming years.

Consultation involved publishing, pre-statutory consultation document on the Council's website, setting out the reasons for the proposals and how comments could be made was issued via email to all stakeholders and hardcopies were also made available. This document also invited 'online' participation through the use of 'survey monkey'. A consultation meeting on the proposal was held for parents/carers of Rainham Village Primary School on the 22 November 2016. A record of this meeting together with the analysis of responses received during the consultation period is as detailed in the consultation feedback report.

The expansion of Rainham Village primary school to three forms of entry will enable the local authority meet the need for additional school places in the Rainham & South Hornchurch Planning area. The birth rate in this area has increased by 6% between calendar years 2010 and 2014.

The local authority's reception class forecasts indicates that there will be a shortfall of places from 2017/18 in this planning area as shown below

Demand for places across this area has been high with a projected deficit as shown above. Whybridge Infant School admitted an additional class in Year 1 in

September 2016 to accommodate the high demand.

The Rainham and Beam Park Housing bid has been approved with over 3500 units to be delivered over the period 2015/16 to 2021/22. This is likely to result in a continuation and probable escalation of the projected increase in pupil numbers.

Rainham Village is a good school which is popular and in an appropriate location for additional numbers to be accommodated.

Further proposals to address the additional school place need are being developed and will be consulted on at a later date. The need for additional school places from 2020/21 will be delivered via a new 3FE free school. The Vine Schools Trust has already submitted an application to sponsor the new free school in the area.
