Maths

Continuation of formal written methods of division and multiplication.
Place value and counting, including negative numbers. Partitioning numbers. Halving, doubling and rounding numbers. Order and compare numbers and temperatures. Solving problems. Roman numerals to 100. Describe and extend number sequences. Fractions, adding and subtracting, equivalent and decimal fractions, counting on and back and compare and order unit fractions. Fractions and division. Problem solving. Co-ordinates, position and translation, symmetry. 2D shape. Area and multiplication. Written addition and subtraction using money and measures. Geometric shapes, triangles, angles. Formal written methods of addition and subtraction. Solve problems using information presented in bar charts, pictograms tables and other graphs.
