

## Seasonal Flu Vaccination Programme 2016-17

In Gloucestershire, the following children are currently being invited for the flu vaccination by their GP practice:

- All children aged 2, 3 and 4 years born between September 1 2011 and August 31 2014
- All children in reception and years 1, 2 and 3 at school and;
- All children aged 2 to 17 years with long-term health conditions.

For most children the flu vaccination is given as a nasal spray.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness in children and can cause serious complications so it's important to protect children. Vaccinating children means the infection is less able to spread, and so it helps to protect their brothers and sisters, and other family members and friends including their parents and grandparents.
