School Uniform

A reminder for Parents/Carers of the Uniform children need to wear in school, including PE kit;

Girls Uniform

- Grey Skirt/Pinafore or Trousers
- White Shirt or Polo Shirt
- Red Cardigan or Jumper (available with school logo)
- Black school shoes (no trainers)
- A waterproof coat should be brought to school each day
- Long hair should be tied back

Boys Uniform

- Grey Trousers
- White Shirt or Polo Shirt
- Red Jumper (available with school logo)
- Black school shoes (no trainers)
- A waterproof coat should be brought to school each day
- Long hair should be tied back

PE Kit

Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school everyday and takes it home at weekends.

All pupils should have:

- Plain red shorts
- White T-shirt (available with school logo)
- White ankle/trainer socks
- Navy or Black Track suit top and bottoms for cold weather
- Trainers

All PE equipment should be kept in a PE bag and placed in their class cloakroom. The PE bag should be clearly marked with the pupil's name on it.

All clothing including PE kit must be clearly marked with your child's name.
