Subject Areas History We will continue to look at chronology of people and changes relating to political, military and social events. The sequence of time relating to empire, civilisation, parliament and peasantry will also be a key focus. In addition, our focus will be on 850AD to 1066 AD where we will construct a timeline consisting of when the Anglo Saxons/Vikings and Normans ruled. Art and Design & Design and Technology We will continue to look at art from the above time period as well as weaponry and work with different materials, ie) collage, 3D Structures using different fabrics as well various materials when drawing and painting. Computing & Programming Children will continue to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly. We will also be conducting digital research based on our learning in history and science. In addition, the children will learn to use audacity.
<u>English</u> As a class we will continue to read our class novel together and discuss it chapter by chapter as well as completing a variety of short related writing tasks. We will do further reading and responding to detective crime fiction and applying the features of crime fiction to our own writing. Once completed we will record our stories on Movie maker on the I-pads. Each week the class will continue to have spellings to learn appropriate to each individual. In addition, grammar and punctuation will be a weekly focus. Year 6 will

continue to receive some booster English lessons to support them with the forthcoming SATs tests.

Maths

As a class we will be covering: number, fractions, measurement, geometry, statistics and problems solving will be linked to each area so children can use and apply their skills/strategies learnt to 'real life'. Mental arithmetic will be a weekly focus and the children need to know all their multiplication tables therefore practise will be imperative for those children and weekly support will be provided. Year 6 will continue to receive some booster maths lessons to support them with the forthcoming SATs tests.

Religious Education

This term we will be continuing to learn about ascension and Pentecost and the significance of these terms. We will focus on what ways do these events and beliefs make Christianity distinctive.

Science

We will continue in science to focus on living things and the environment in which they live; but will be classifying all living things into broad groups. We will use Carl Linnaeus' classification findings to design and challenge others with classification 'trees', based on our own research.

Physical Education

The class will be taught athletics by West Lancashire sports partnership every Friday morning for this half term. The children will also receive some orienteering training in and around the school grounds keeping within the school's boundaries.

MFL

The children will be taught French in order to respond orally to simple questions/instructions. The class will also learn elements of the language through aural exercises. In addition, the children will write in French in response to what they are taught.
