The effect of the premium on pupil's PE and Sport participation and attainment

The aim of the Primary Sports Premium is to increase participation in sport and physical activity. As part of this, children will value the benefits of living a healthy lifestyle as well as the numerous other benefits (e.g. social) that participating in sport can bring. Another main aim for the Premium money is to support the delivery of high quality Physical Education and increase teacher confidence via their continuing professional development.

At Holton le Clay Infant School, the our Sport Premium supports the role of an experienced sports coach (JB Sports) working collaboratively with the school by:

- Offering a variety of extra-curricular sports activities over the year across KS1
- Raising Teachers understanding of the minimum expected standards for their pupils in each of the PE elements.
- Consistently delivering good to outstanding provision in all elements of P.E.

Our pupils have also attended a Lincs Sports Partnership inter-school competition event, allowing Year 2 children access to competitive sports that aimed to aspire children to lead healthier, active lifestyles and to develop skills, self-esteem and confidence.

Balanceability programme has also visited school to provide a workshop for our pupils in Year 1, developing new skills, self-esteem and confidence and developing a culture of enthusiasm of sport and physical activity.

Registers show increased pupil numbers and wider variety of extra-curricular sports clubs, with regular attendance throughout school academic year. Weekly clubs this academic year were Yoga, Multi-skills and Archery and Football. Our pupils, through pupil discussions and sports coach assessment, have developed skills, self-esteem and confidence during these sessions.

Staff have enhanced their sport skills/teaching by participating in lessons led by sports coaches in a variety of sporting activities.

Class Rise and Shine club held termly - Pupils to be able to make healthy life choices and have a deeper understanding on how to stay healthy and active through; healthy living competitions, games, word searches, memory games and discussions re food choices.
