

## Pupil Premium Report 2015/2016

### What is Pupil Premium Funding?

- The Government introduced the Pupil Premium Grant in April 2011. This grant, which is additional to main school funding, is seen by the Government as the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between identified groups of children.
- This Pupil Premium Funding is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (or who have been eligible at some time during the past 6 years); children who have been 'looked after' continuously for more than six months; and children of service families.
- Schools currently receive:
  - £1320 for each pupil who is having, or has had, Free School Meals
  - £1900 for each Looked After Child
  - £300 for each Service child
- The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools and is clearly identifiable. Schools can decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

This funding is received on an annual basis and is used in a variety of ways to improve pupil attainment, progress and participation – helping to overcome barriers to learning.

In deciding where this money is to be spent, we have used professional judgement and current educational research (including the Sutton Trust EEF Toolkit) to ensure best value for money.

At Exning Primary School, we support all of our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching supplemented by interventions to support vulnerable learners as and when required. The School Leadership Team and Governing Body monitor the impact of all spending and interventions, including Pupil Premium.

### Objectives for Pupil Premium (PP) in this school

- The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and to raise the standard of achievement for these identified pupils e.g. 1:1 tuition, extra TA hours, subsidising school trips/activities, funding wrap-around-care etc
- The funding will be used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers.
- We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most and that it makes a significant impact on their education and lives.

### For the financial year 2015/2016 we received £39,320, for 32 (17% approx) pupils who were entitled to benefit from the additional funding.

***NB: Although we are extremely proud of the hard work and achievement of all our children, please bear in mind our pupil premium (PP) children are a small percentage, on the whole, with each child representing 33% in some cases. Therefore, all PP data should be treated with caution.***

The impact of this extra funding on the learning of our Pupil Premium children was as follows:

2016:

- **Y1 Phonics:** All 4 pupils who were eligible for Pupil Premium (13%) achieved the expected standard for the Phonics.

- **End of KS1 (Year 2):** PP children (10%) were significantly above National Average(NA) in Reading, Writing and Maths.

- **End of KS2 Attainment (Year 6):** This cohort achieved broadly in line with National Average. Of the 3 PP children, 2 were on the SEN register, both having specific learning difficulties.
