

Here are some pieces of history from our school taken hundreds of years ago. Hope you enjoy!

May 20th 1881

Taught a new tune. Tried to teach children special lessons on neatness and writing. Criticism lesson of how to restore life to apparently dead—through drawing

May 1906

Details of Grants:

Mixes children 98 at 22	£107.16
Infants 57 at 17	£48.00
Fee grant 155 at 10	£77.10
Total	£233.15

June 1893

I have to note that the children are slow to buy books. The work has gone on with vigour. I note that one or two children having reached thirteen years and passed the necessary standard, are employed at the Mill one half-day and simply run about the other half. I have sent a note to parents to show that more benefit would accrue to the child by keeping up his work in school.


