Pupil Premium Grant expenditure (PPG)

Report to parents: 3 Year Summary 2014 - 2016

The 'Pupil Premium' is direct government funding for schools designed to ensure that all pupils make the best progress possible and narrow the attainment gap, regardless of their socio-economic background. A sum of money is given to the school for each pupil on role who is currently or who has been in receipt of 'Free School Meals' (£1,600 per child) at any point in the last 6 years and children who are 'Looked After' by the Local Authority (£1,400 per child).

Objectives

The targeted and strategic use of Pupil Premium will help us achieve the school's vision to maximise achievement, nurture, inspire and challenge all pupils.

- To ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are eligible for free school meals. We will allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil the school has identified as being socially disadvantaged.

Measuring the Impact of Pupil Premium Grant

Successful interventions, appropriate to the individual child's needs, have raised the attainment of vulnerable pupils. Based on Teacher Assessment evidence confirms that children are responding well to the initiatives provided. The school are confident that the new assessment procedures implemented in September 2014 will confirm this at the end of the Summer Term 2015.
