Dear Parents

That time is here . . . the Year 3/4 residential trip is upon us. I just wanted to remind you of some key points:

The weather looks hot – so NAMED sun cream/hats are essential. However the children must still bring their wellies (not only in case of showers) as we are taking part in stream dipping and their trainers would get very soggy!!!

I have reattached the slide with 'what they need to bring' on so that you have it easily to hand. The complete powerpoint remains on the website.

If your child is on ANY medication this must be handed in with the relevant medical forms completed to either myself or Mr Anley on the Monday morning.

On Monday morning your child comes to school at the normal time. Please bring their belongings in to Mr Anley's room which will enable ease of putting them on to the mini bus. We aim to depart at 09:30, so if you say good bye at normal bell time it then allows us to get them calmly on to the bus once we are 100% sure that we have all that we require.

On Wednesday afternoon we will arrive back in school between 2:30-3:00pm – please come to collect at normal time and you will be able to retrieve all their items and of course your very tired son/daughter.

Please do not pack any chocolate in your child's suitcase, in this weather it will melt and leave a huge mess, I will be buying some snacks as well as the food that is provided by the centre.

I will do my utmost to inform Mrs Tremlin how things are progressing and she will in turn send a parentmail on Tuesday and Wednesday. Please remember that there is no mobile phone coverage, so I am reliant on a time when I am not required to look after the children and can get to the centre phone. Being with the children will always be our priority.

We have had no feedback from parents with regards to any food allergies or have any vegetarians on the trip, so all children will be served from the main menu.

Any further question please do ask, it is going to be lots of fun although I am sure that some children are feeling slightly apprehensive. As I said before, the great thing about this trip is we are just 40 mins away. A photo tucked away, or a short note or two from yourselves, hidden, can often help get rid of those initial night nerves I have found.
