KEY STAGE 1 / Children's Centre

Year 2

What an exciting week of discovery Year 2 have had this week. We delved into the past and examined lots of fossils in the Life Long Ago Workshop. In the afternoon, we looked in wonder at Millie the baby TRex. We couldn't believe the size of her teeth. We've also found out much more about Katie Morag and thought in detail about her character. KEY STAGE 2

Year 4

This week Year 4 have been learning about the digestive system. We now know how food travels through our body (from one end to the other!) and the proper scientific words for these body parts. In Maths we had to research and record the temperature and rainfall in the different habitats we have studied around the world. We created line graphs and bar charts to display the data.
