Sarah Lomax will be taking over the lunchtime role in September and we look forward to her continuing the wide range of activities on offer.

The **end of year discos** organised by KABS are on Thursday 20th July, 5.30-6.45pm for N, R and KS1 children, all children to be accompanied by an adult, and 7-8.15pm for KS2 children. The KABS committee felt it was better to split the discos and then music and games can be best suited to the two different age ranges. Entry will be £2.50 and there will be hot dogs, drinks and sweets for sale. Year 6 children will be presented with their certificates by the KABS committee during their disco.

From now on parent cars are **not allowed** at the school entrance, driveway or car park between the hours of 8.30am and 4.30pm unless a blue badge is held. This includes picking your child up from Nursery at dinner time. The car park is for the use of staff and school visitors only. The *only* exception to this is if you are collecting your child during the day due to illness.

There will be a member of staff present in the OOSC if you need to leave your prospective Reception child there.
