It was also confirmed by the Head Teacher that in relation to Minute 19 the School was compliant with the Accounting Officer’s key responsibilities and important financial management and governance issues as set out in the Chief Executive of the Education Funding Agency’s letter.</p>

<p>6.</p>	<p>Report of Internal Assurance (Clive Owen & Co LLP)</p> <p>Further to Minute 9 (Finance Committee 7th November 2016) the School’s external auditors (Clive Owen & Co LLP) provided a report on their ongoing independent oversight of the Academy’s financial affairs, in addition to internal procedures already carried out by the Academy’s Business Team. The following areas were looked at in accordance with the agreed Schedule of Work:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regularity • Payroll • Purchases • Accounting System • Expenses and petty cash • Financial Procedures Manual • Governors meeting minutes 	

	<p>It was noted all previous recommendations had been implemented. Recommendations from the Autumn Term report were:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A salary costs reconciliation to agree payroll reports to the expenditure charge in the nominal ledger should be performed monthly. • Orders should be raised and authorised for all credit card purchases. <p>RESOLVED:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) That the report be noted. b) That it be noted that the recommendations had all been implemented. c) That the Business Team be congratulated on behalf of the Governors for the work they had been undertaking and this successful report. <p><i>(Note: Governor Mrs D Leigh arrived at the meeting at approximately 5.10 pm.)</i></p>	
<p>7.</p>	<p>Premises Report (Including maintenance & planning issues.)</p> <p>The Head Teacher presented the premises report covering the period from October 2016 to March 2017. The report provided an update of work being undertaken in maintenance, management and health & safety issues across the site. It also provided information regarding costs incurred.</p> <p>The Head Teacher advised two Fire Alarms had occurred since the last report submitted to Governors. One on the Junior building due to a leak in the toilets and one in the Infant building due to dust in the sensor. Both evacuations had been carried out successfully. Procedures had been updated in response to issues highlighted by the evacuations.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <p>That the report be noted.</p>	
<p>8.</p>	<p>Building Works</p> <p>The Head Teacher provided a verbal report on works requiring attention in the School. She advised that classrooms in both schools required painting. It was agreed that this should go out to tender and should be based on a classroom by classroom basis as not all would require attention.</p>	

	<p>The Head Teacher explored the possibility with the Finance Committee of a new frontage to the Infant building entrance in order to provide a foyer in that area. This would provide a more professional entrance and help with the safeguarding of the Infant children. It was noted there had been no safeguarding issues which had occurred due to the current Infant door arrangement. The cost of a new foyer area would be approximately £50,000 and a schedule of works and costings was circulated at the meeting for consideration.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) That it be agreed in principle that the Infant Foyer scheme was a good idea, however further consideration would have to be given in the light of budgetary constraints. b) That a report be brought back for Governors consideration to ascertain if the Infant Foyer project could be brought in at a reduced cost. c) That the painting of classrooms be put out to tender (On a classroom by Classroom basis). <p>9. Report from Human Resources</p> <p>The Head Teacher (E.M) verbally advised the Committee that the Human Resources Service Level Agreement (SLA) was now being provided by Stockton Borough Council's Human Resources Team, at a reduced cost of that provided under the previous SLA. A copy of the new HR provision is available on the Governors' Learning Platform.</p> <p>She also advised that there were currently three long term staff absences which were being managed by the School and HR.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <p>That the report be noted.</p> <p>10. School Improvement Plan</p> <p>The Head Teacher reported on the 2016/17 School Improvement Plan (SIP) and the associated costs. She advised with regard to 'writing' there were small associated costs including when staff were working on this area of the curriculum. The biggest outlay had been the purchase of new books with a £12,000 spend from Reserves. It was noted that approximately £4,000 had been put towards this spend from donations from the PFA and commission from the recent Book Fair in school (which resulted in £1,500 of books being donated.) 	<p>disadvantaged pupils/SEN/EAL was provided by Pupil Premium Fund and a copy of this was published on the School web-site.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <p>That the report be noted.</p> <p>11. Budget Update – 2016/17</p> <p>The Head Teacher and Mrs D. Nielson (Business Team) provided an update of the 2016/17 Budget and provided a summary report which was attached to the Agenda. It was noted that there had been an increase in employee’s costs of £26,000 due to fixed contracts and apprenticeships. There had also been a slight increase in supply teaching costs. With regard to premises there had been an underspend of approximately £10,000 pro rata of current spend. With regards to the Curriculum there was a £7,000 additional spend. There was an overspend of £11,000 with regard to the establishment due to an increase in supply costs. There had also been a slight increase in business rates. The current drawdown was £33,000.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <p>That the report be noted.</p> <p>12. Management Accounts Cash Flow</p> <p>The Head Teacher and Mrs D. Nielson (Business Team) provided an update on the Management Accounts Cash Flow. They advised that the income was largely as anticipated and in a positive position.</p> <p>Governors suggested that an estimate of gas and electricity costs for the kitchens should be made in proportion to the amount they use and separated from the whole school utility costs.</p> <p>RESOLVED:</p> <p>That the report be noted</p> <p>13. Investments</p> <p>The Head Teacher and Mrs D. Nielson (Business Team) reported on the School’s current investments. They advised that the Nationwide investment had reached maturity a month ago and with the permission of the Chair of the Finance Committee this had been put into a holding account.
