To master practical skills - textiles.	<p>Milestone 2 Join textiles with appropriate stitching. Select the most appropriate techniques to decorate textiles.</p> <p>Milestone 3 Join textiles with a combination of stitching techniques (such as back stitch for seams and running stitch to attach decoration).</p>	Children to design their Roman purse on Worksheet 1A then create it following their design. Support children with creating the eyelets and threading the cord through the holes.	Children to design their purse on Worksheet 1B then create it following their design. Encourage children to think about how the decoration on their purse could be made to look 'Roman' and ensure they work with care and attention to detail.	Tell the children that a Roman man/woman has travelled in time and is looking for new ideas to take back to ancient Rome with him/her. He/she has asked the children to design a new type of purse to keep money in but that he/she still wants it to look Roman. Challenge children to design and make a different kind of purse that will be useful for the Romans and that is decorated in a Roman style (e.g. with mosaic patterns, with pictures of gods and goddesses, etc).
