Sundon Park Junior School Weekly Newsletter

Message from the Headteacher

I'd like to offer you a very warm welcome to the first of our weekly news letters for this year.

The children have spent the week focusing on expectations for work and behaviour around the school. They've had tasters of key aspects of the curriculum such as handwriting, spellings, English, maths and PSHE, to make sure they are ready to live up to our high expectations when the formal timetable begins next week.

At lunchtime the children have been having fun taking part in a wide variety of activities to help them to settle back into school and to make new friends in a safe way. Each year group has a zone in which they can play games with other children, using a variety of equipment. This helps the younger children to feel safe on the playground whilst ensuring our expectations for behaviour for all the pupils are understood and followed. These arrangements will be reviewed in a couple of weeks to see how they are working with the School Council being included in this review.

The library is open for any children to read quietly from 1.00 until 1.30 every day and is manned by the Family Worker or another member of the pastoral team should the children wish to speak to them. The Courtyard has quiet activities such as games and colouring for those children who prefer a more peaceful space and Mrs Reed is already working hard with the children to make sure the flower beds are ready for winter. The fenced-off area of the playground is once again being used by the Playground Buddies to run activities for any children who want to make new friends with a little support from these year 6 pupils. The ICT clubs will begin next week with Mr Hume helping the children to develop their knowledge and skills.

We do not have zones on the playground at morning break so the children are free to play together. The older children have been asked to give the Year 3 children some time to settle in at the beginning of term.

Music and PE lessons have already started, with the specialist music teachers from Luton Music Service coming in to work with all the classes and our own Mr Osborne, a PE specialist, working with all the classes at least once a week.

We offer a wide range of clubs and activities before and after school. The letters for these went out earlier in the week and there has been a massive response for places. Where these are run by a member of our school staff there is no charge, but we have no choice but to charge for those offered by outside coaches as they have to be paid for their time. If you have a child who would like to take part and is on free school meals, please come in and speak to Mrs Outlaw as we are often able to fund places in clubs in these circumstances.

It has been lovely to see so many of you at the gate in the morning. You will find Mr Bradbury (our Family Worker), Mrs Reed (our Behaviour Support Administrator), Mrs Mackenzie-Skea (Deputy Headteacher) outside with me most days. Please do take the opportunity to say hello and to ask any questions you may have - we are always pleased to help if we possibly can. Should you require a longer opportunity to talk to one of us, please ask for an appointment and we will be more than happy to arrange that. If you are concerned about an in-class issue - either academic or pastoral - please speak to the class teacher in the first instance. If you do not feel that the issue has been resolved, then please speak to Mrs Mackenzie-Skea, who is responsible for years 3 and 4, or Mrs Healy (Assistant Headteacher) who is responsible for Years 5 and 6.

We are happy for parents to send goodies into school for children's birthdays; however, these will remain with the Teacher until the end of the day for children to give them straight to the adult collecting them, who can then make the decision as to whether they can eat them.

Below is a brief overview of some of the curriculum topics being studied in class this term.

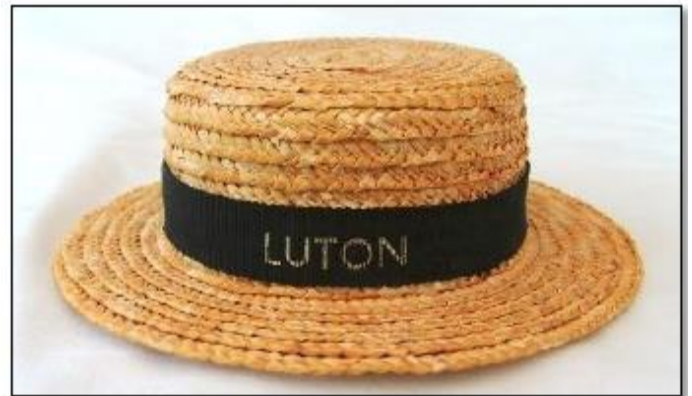
Year 3

Year 3's topic this term is 'Where are we?'. We are using geographical skills to study our local environment and community. In science we are learning about plants. We are able to use the school garden, pond and courtyard to support our learning. We will be learning new skills to sketch and paint in art this term. We will be using our scientific knowledge to add detail to our plant drawings.



Year 4

Our topic in Year 4 is entitled 'Mad Hatters'. We are incorporating the local history of hat making in Luton whilst we study the Victorians this term. In Design and Technology we will look at Victorian inventions and will link this to our science topic 'Electricity'. In art we will learn about the Victorian designer William Morris and will produce prints based on his designs.



Year 5



A long time ago in a galaxy far, far away..... This term in a school not so far away, the Year 5's are learning about the earth and space. They are incorporating their geographical skills, scientific skills and art skills to learn all about this exciting topic.



Year 6

Year 6 are using their archaeological skills to discover facts about the Ancient Egyptians in their topic 'Pyramids, Papyrus and Power'. They are using this as inspiration for their design and technology lessons and will be building cams and pulleys as they design models that would be able to move the great stones of the pyramids. They will be gaining a deeper knowledge about light in their science lessons. A bright future for year 6!
