Nursery places

We still have some afternoon nursery places available for children who will be three by the end of December. If you or any of your friends or relatives are interested in taking up a nursery place please speak to the staff in the Nursery or to Mrs Hudson in the office.

The new style books bags are available from the office and are now £6. Please call at the office if you would like to buy one for your child.

New school diaries

All children from Reception to Year 6 have been given a new school diary for this year. Please could you sign your child's diary on the home school agreement page and on the e-safety page. Additionally, when you listen to your child read, or need to pass a message on to the class teacher, please write it in the diary. School staff will sign the diary every week. Please could you sign the parents' section of the diary weekly to let school staff know that you are listening to your child read and that you know the homework your child has. The maths passport targets are now also within the school diary. Please help your child practice their maths passport targets regularly at home. Thank you for your support with this.

NAMES IN UNIFORM

Please can we ask that you put your child's name in **ALL** items of their clothing. We have been having difficulty returning lost items to children as clothes are not named. Please write in your child's name in all their clothes and shoes with a permanent or laundry marker available from most supermarkets. All classes have a laundry marker pen and staff will write names in clothes that are not named. This is to help you keep your child's belongings with them and save you money! Thank you for your co-operation in this. Any items of clothing that is found will be sent to the lost property box near the children's entrance. Named clothing will be returned to the owner.

Dinner Money

Just a reminder, dinner money is £1.65 a day or £8.25 per week and should be placed in an envelope in the money collection point by the children's entrance. Any money for clubs and trips can be posted in the money collection point by the school office.

Registering for free school meals

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 now receive free school meals, regardless of whether they are eligible to register for them. **However it is important that if you are eligible, you register for free school meals. Registering for free meals means that school receives valuable additional funding for each child and means you are entitled to other benefits for your child, such as free school milk. If you receive any of the following you can register for free school meals:**

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income Based)
- Child Tax Credit (but **NOT** Working Tax Credit*) and an income less than the amount set by the government (to find out this amount search for "Free School Meals" on www.bradford.gov.uk.)
- Universal Credit

*Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit 'run-on' (a payment they may get for 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) their children can get Free School Meals for this period. **Remember if you register it entitles you to access other benefits, for example free milk for your child at school. Additionally, the school receives extra funding for every child that is registered as eligible for free school meals and this money is used to help improve the progress and attainment of children in school. So.... if you are eligible to register for free meals please do so! If you would like any help or advice in registering, please come and speak to Mrs Hudson or Mrs Shields in the office.**
