Developing the Teaching Assistant Role

This programme runs over two half-day sessions designed to develop and identify behaviours, skills and knowledge expected of a teaching assistant. Attendees will produce a Personal Development Plan (PDP) to identify SMART objectives to improve their knowledge or practice in these areas.

This course is for:

Teaching Assistants who wish to develop their knowledge and skills to improve their role in school, considering their current practice against national standards.

Course aims:

To cover the principles and practice of a teaching support role.

Content will include; how to support colleagues in planning, delivery and assessment, factors impacting learning, recognising the contribution of parents and carers and working collaboratively with colleagues, professional values and behaviour.

Two Half-Day sessions:

Session 1 - Professional Development

- Collaborative and co-operative working with colleagues
- Improving knowledge and practice
- Effective communication with children, young people, colleagues, parents and carers
- Modelling expected behaviour in school
- Identifying development opportunities

Session 2 - Knowledge and Skills

- Contributing to the planning of learning activities
- Understanding the key factors that affect children's learning
- Monitoring learning to provide focused support and feedback
- Use a range of assessment techniques to support evaluation of progress
- Preparing a CPD portfolio

Christine Larkin is an experienced teacher-educator who has led on PGCE, B.Ed, Scitt and TA qualification programmes for over 20 years in London and the South East.
