
English

Maths

We have also began our new approach to maths using *Maths No Problem*. We have been exploring various ways to answer contextualised questions, using a range of equipment some we have used before and others which are new to us. This new approach has allowed lots more time to discuss as a class what we have discovered and shown there can be multiple ways to find the same answer. Useful Information

Reading: Children are expected to read at 4 times a week, for approximately 10 minutes. This needs to be recorded in their reading diary with an adult signature. They are also encouraged to read their own books from home and they may update their reading diaries accordingly. Please encourage children to bring in their reading book and diary every day as they need their diary for their spelling sessions.

P.E: We strongly suggest that children keep their P.E. kit in school to avoid forgetting it.

Homework: Children will be given spellings, on a Wednesday, to complete that will run alongside our Read, Write, Inc spelling sessions for a test on Monday. Teachers will now provide a pack of Maths and English activities for the children to complete throughout the term. These packs will provide approximately 15 - 30 minutes per week of additional core-subject worksheets linked closely to what the children have been learning that term in class. The children will be guided to what pieces of Maths and English work they should complete each week. It is important that they undertake any homework set as it directly links to work they have completed in class and, as such, aids understanding.
