Summary of PPG spending school year 2016/17

Objectives in spending PPG:

Set realistic objectives that focus on specific groups of pupils or subjects.

1. To raise attainment of lower attainers in all year groups. Identify barriers to learning and which groups of children need either one to one or group intervention support particularly in literacy and/or numeracy. Review the progress of these children at pupil progress meetings with teachers and review meetings with parents and all staff involved, including those from external agencies
2. Barriers for this group of children identified, all staff aware of this for the children with whom they work and actions to meet individual needs planned throughout the year
3. Identify which children require extra "in class" support to be provided by class teacher and class teaching assistant as appropriate. Monitor progress of these children at termly pupil progress meetings and also monitor the impact of teaching and learning strategies, mini interventions, pre learning groups
4. To provide financial support to vulnerable groups to ensure that they can access the wider curriculum, ensuring equal opportunities for all children
 - Off-site visits
 - Residential visits (in Year 4 and Year 5)
 - Music lessons
 - After school clubs
 - Morning Sport clubs
 - School uniform

Outcomes to date:

- A high number of children from Aston All Saints to join either before/after school or holiday clubs, including children from vulnerable groups. School will sign post specific children if school feels the child will benefit and may otherwise not take up the opportunity. Letters with information are sent to all families entitled to support through the pupil premium funding
- Identified children receive one to one or group support with their learning and the progress is reviewed termly with the child, parent, school staff and relevant agencies
- School nurture group work supports vulnerable children with social and emotional needs
- Interventions in literacy and numeracy are delivered from Year 1 upwards and pupil progress meetings show that the majority of these children make expected progress from their starting points
- Families receive financial support with wider curriculum opportunities enabling all children to have equal opportunities in the full range of activities available

Attainment and achievement

By the end of Y6 in 2017 of the 6 pupil premium children- 67% met the expected standard in reading, 50% in writing, 83% in SPAG and 100% in maths

Progress from the end of KS1 for these Y6 pupil premium children –

100% made expected or better progress in reading and maths and 50% made expected or better progress in writing
