



Summary of PE Sports Premium Funding 2016-2017

During the academic year, the government continued to provide additional funding of £150 million to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding was provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport and was allocated to primary school headteachers. The funding was ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

This provided a fantastic opportunity to develop our facilities, staff and equipment with the aim of engaging and motivating more of our pupils into sport and promoting a healthier lifestyle.

We attended the Quadkids B team event in LKS2 to provide further opportunity for more children than ever to participate in sport. Our LKS2 team finished in 3rd place. We won the Superstars event this year for the first time. Our girls' team won gold and the boys' team got silver resulting in an overall win. We won the TARDIS UKS2 Swimming gala. We entered two SEN events this year and won gold at the Boccia / Kurling event and our boys' team won gold at the Indoor Athletics and the girls' team won silver. We entered an A and B team into the Football league for the first time, giving more children the opportunity to play. Children have attended AGT events and festivals, having been selected and invited to attend. We finished 6th in a Tag Rugby tournament run at Hutton Grammar School.
