Halloween

Below are some tips from Bedfordshire Police and a message from Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue regarding Halloween Safety:

- Always be accompanied by an adult when you are trick-or-treating.
- You should only go to houses of people that you know and who are happy for you to call.
- Stay safe, keep to places that you know and are well lit. Do not take short cuts through gardens, alleyways or parks.
- Watch out for traffic - drivers might not see you.
- If you are wearing a mask make sure that you can see where you are going and are aware of your surroundings.
- Carry a torch and a fully charged mobile phone (if you have one).

Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Service want everyone to enjoy a safe and spooky Halloween, but every year many adults and children are injured when lit candles come into contact with trailing costumes and wigs. At the moment these costumes are classed as toys and therefore are not subject to the same requirements as children's clothing. It is important to be aware of the danger this poses and that costumes are kept away from open flames. It is also important that children know what to do if their clothing is set alight. You can make a game of teaching your children to "Stop, drop, cover and roll" if their costume does catch light. This means having them practice stopping still, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.

Next Week in English

Year 3

Using the smoothies we made on Friday as a stimulus for our innovation writing, we will write instructions for making delicious smoothies. We will be focusing on using time adverbials to order our steps and imperative verbs to write our instructions.

Year 4

Next week Year 4 will be using their persuasive writing skills to create adverts for Victorian jobs. During history lessons they have been learning about the jobs that the children used to do, the poor conditions they worked in and the long hours they worked. They will now have to try and find the positive aspects of the job, use exaggeration and other persuasive techniques learned to write a successful advert.

Year 5

Year 5 have been learning a new text this week about a new mobile phone and all its fantastic features. Next week they are going to be persuading us to buy other spy gear.

Year 6

Next week in Year 6, we will be continuing to learn about persuasive writing. We will be using the different persuasive features we have learnt about to create our own persuasive writing. Classes will also be using imperative and modal verbs to influence the reader. We will also be presenting our writing to the rest of the class.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will be continuing to work on addition, looking at complements and multiple strategies used to add mentally.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to use formal methods for addition and subtraction. They will be using their estimation and rounding skills to check their answers make sense.

Year 5

Next week in Year 5 we will be revising place value, ordering and comparing numbers up to a million.

Year 6

Next week in maths the children will be continuing to learn how to solve arithmetical problems using mental strategies and word problems using the formal written methods for all calculations.
