<b>Reception</b>	This week we have been learning the letters and sounds 'p' 'i' and 'n' we have enjoyed playing find the sounds and making words. Next week we will consolidate these letters with lots of games. In literacy we have had lots of fun creating a new version of Humpty Dumpty; the children have drawn pictures for the new nursery rhyme, acted out the new rhyme! What wonderful work. Next week we will start looking at the Incy Wincy Spider nursery rhyme. In Maths we have been working hard with recognising numerals to 10 and careful counting; we have also tried writing the numerals to 10 and finding correct amount of objects. Next week we will consolidate numbers to 10 and start looking at finding one more and one less. In RE we have been looking at Gods love for people and how we show love to people. As part of the homework this week the children should have brought home a sheet for God's love. I would like the children to draw a picture or stick a photograph in of their family. <b>Year 1</b>	The children have been working very hard writing first person this week, and pretending that they are the Big Bad Wolf in Literacy.
