<b>PE planning programme</b>	<p>Increased three way differentiation of planning, which extends the gifted and talented pupils', whilst also supporting and aiding lower attaining children.</p> <p>Staff confidence has also increased due to the structured skills based planning and differentiation.</p>
<b>Professional development</b> Continual professional development offered to all staff through the Calderdale Sports Programme which included gymnastics and dance.	<p>Standards of teaching and learning enhanced, with teachers being up-skilled in how to greater differentiate PE lessons and how to challenge gifted and talented children.</p> <p>Evidenced in recent PE planning scrutiny, with greater links made to curriculum 14 and lessons exhibiting greater personalisation.</p>
<b>Hiring specialist PE teachers and coaches</b>	<p>Staff provided with training and guidance. Children encouraged to take part in a range of sports, which has led to more children being entered into sporting competitions.</p>
