Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in Year 3, we will be starting to write our own innovated versions of our story, The Tunnel. We will be focusing particularly on writing effective beginnings and endings.

Year 4

This week, Year 4 will be innovating the story The Canal. The children will be creating their own characters and setting for a warning story. We will be learning how to punctuate speech correctly to use within our stories.

Year 5

In English next week, Year 5 are starting to write a story about an alien abduction focusing on including suspense in our writing.

Year 6

Next week in Year 6, we will be writing in the same style as the story extract we have been looking at together. We will be creating our own story maps but they will substitute parts and/or add extra details. We will be learning to create atmosphere in our stories and thinking about how we can keep the reader engaged.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Year 3 are continuing their work on mental subtraction, learning different methods to subtract ones, tens and hundreds from three-digit numbers.

Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to find missing numbers in formal written addition. We will be learning to solve formal written subtraction with regrouping of thousands and will then find the missing number. We will end the week using our skills to solve problems.

Year 5

Next week in Year 5, we will be revising multiplying whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.

We will be learning to solve number problems and practical problems that involve place value.

Year 6

Next week in maths, Year 6 will be learning to simplify fractions using their knowledge of common factors and common multiples. They will also be continuing to practise their mental strategies with larger number.
