Reception	It has been another busy week in Reception with all the children working really hard. In Maths we have started our 2d shape unit and have enjoyed looking for 2d shapes outside. Our history topic this half term is nursing in the past and we are looking at significant people linked to this. Our School will be taking part in the town parade to the cenotaph on Remembrance Sunday morning. Please can any child who would like to join us, meet our staff at The Tin Chapel at 9.20am ready for the parade to set off at 9.30am. We will go to a short service at St George's Church before going over to The Cenotaph at 10.30am where Father Bob will meet us. Rio and Leah will lay the wreath on behalf of our school. Please could children wear their school uniform. Thank you for your support with this, it would be lovely to see a good representation from our school.

What is happening week commencing 13th November:

Year 5 will be going to Mass at 9am on Monday, please could children from year 5 be in school for **8.45am** so we are able to complete registration and check our school meals.

Our building work has started in our office; this work is due to last for approximately 16 weeks. Just to remind you - we are unable to use the Lonsdale Road entrance to school. During this time access to school for parents will be from the Queen Street gates and from the door on the right. There is a door bell on the door and we would ask that you ring this and wait a few minutes as our temporary offices are in the middle of the school so it will take a little longer for staff to come and speak to you. Children will come in and out through the Market Street gates as usual in the morning and after school. Breakfast club children will need to come in through this gate too and enter the building through the door nearest the staffroom which leads into the hall. The building work will causes disruption to our school assemblies etc we will be in touch to let you know the alternative arrangements when they have been made.

We are very grateful to Eva and Millie's dad for helping us with the repairs to an area outside in our school grounds. Thank you to Lucien's dad for offering to help with anything we need doing. Sometimes we have little jobs that need doing and we don't have anyone on site that can do them. It is so nice to know that we can call on the help of 'our Dads' ☺ Thank you ☺

ILLNESS Please remember to ring into school in the morning if your child is absent, stating the nature of their illness. Breakfast club is open to children from any class.
