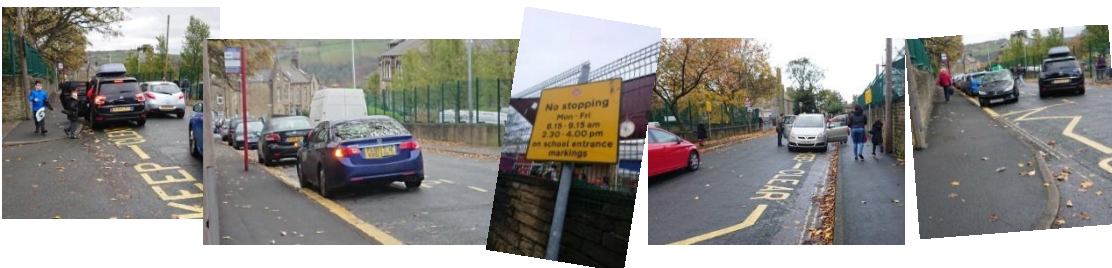

YEAR 6 TRIP Our Y6 children will be visiting the National Holocaust Centre near Nottingham on **Friday next week**. They will be encountering an exhibition that is specifically designed for 10/11yr olds and follows a young German Jewish boy called Leo, as he and his family cope with life in Nazi Germany between 1935 and 1939 as WWII approaches (though of course they didn't know that at the time!). TEXT MESSAGES We have recently had a query about why our texting service sometimes uses incorrect spellings and why messages have to be so brief. We have explained this before, but would like to do so again. Our texting service is paid for through an annual charge and allows us to send an unlimited number of messages without an additional cost. However, we can only use a maximum of 160 characters for each message. This inevitably means that occasionally it is necessary to use abbreviations like 'u' for you, 'grt' for great, 'schl' for school etc., so that we can get the full meaning of the message across in one go. We hope you understand.
