### Pupil Premium- Proposed use of allocated funds

Contribution towards cost of employment of teacher to facilitate two KS2 classes in the mornings

Contribution towards cost of employing teaching assistants to support learning within the classroom thus ensuring teachers can focus their teaching on all pupils equitably in the first instance and enabling them to provide additional support and challenge to enable specific pupils to make accelerated gains and close achievement gaps

To continue to target bespoke intervention according to the shifting needs within each cohort group e.g. teacher lead support and challenge groups

Purchase of resources to support specific children e.g iPad, Thrive specific materials

To deliver a programme of emotional intelligence sessions and provide meet and greet sessions for vulnerable children in the mornings thus removing potential barriers to progress e.g Thrive sessions,

Continued professional development to support effective use of pupil premium funding e.g Thrive continued training, developing and improving feedback prompts to pupils.

To support funding for extra-curricular activities which enhance life experience, build confidence and promote inclusion in learning opportunities in the widest sense e.g. residential trips

### Impact of Pupil Premium Funding

Key Stage 2 SATS: Pupil Premium

100% achieved the national standard in reading. Progress 3.31

100% achieved the national standard in Writing. Progress 0.05

100% achieved the national standard in Mathematics. Progress 2.24

100% achieved the national standard in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling

All Key Stage 2 Pupil Premium

86% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium have made the expected progress in Reading with 43% making greater than expected progress.

61% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium have made the expected progress in Writing with 29% exceeding expected progress

71% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium have made the expected progress in Mathematics

Averaged across the key stage Pupil Premium Children's attainment is lower than that not Non Pupil Premium. However the gaps in attainment have decreased by 14% in Reading, 6% in writing and 18% in maths.

Averaged across the key stage Pupil Premium children have made greater progress than Non Pupil Premium.
