





and a simple piece of soft clay is a perfect match if the child is ready.

Children that are old enough to squeeze your finger can squeeze a piece of soft clay. If they can notice a change in the clay, they are learning that their actions have consequences. This is empowerment.

It encourages more experimentation. The child's brain is taking shape along with the clay. Such self—initiated activity can be the perfect match for the developmental needs of the child.

Clay stimulates the child's curiosity.
