

## Watton at Stone Primary and Nursery School

### Pupil Premium Grant planned expenditure: 2017 - 2018

#### **Introduction**

Every year the school receives additional funding under the title Pupil Premium Grant. This money is to be used to enhance the learning experiences of eligible children, work with vulnerable families in order to raise achievement and to ensure we overcome any barriers to learning.

**Barriers include:** financial, social / emotional and behavioural needs, family circumstances, parents/carers who need support due to their own needs, speech / communication, special educational needs and attendance. All of which could impact negatively on children's learning, progress and development. The impact of the use of this money is measured termly. The school received £32,200 of Pupil Premium Grant this academic year. This is largely based on a sum of £1,320 per child. The purpose of this document is to show how we plan to use this additional funding to benefit PPG children. ## Summary of proposed PPG spending 2017 – 2018

### Reasons behind this strategy (objectives in spending PPG):

To secure at least expected rates of progress in reading, writing and maths for eligible children

To ensure that PPG children are meeting age-related expectations unless they have identified SEND

To narrow the gap in achievement between PPG and non-PPG children

To build self-esteem where necessary and aid readiness for learning in order to raise attainment and progress

100% of PPG pupils not identified with SEND will achieve their target. There will be no significant gaps between data for PPG and non-PPG children

### Summary of how the grant will be spent to address barriers:

- Intervention work/programmes in both KS1 and KS2 (for targeted groups and individuals)
- Speech, language and communication interventions as needed
- Supporting PPG pupils to develop their leadership skills; build confidence / raise self-esteem
- EAL (English as an additional language) interventions where needed
- Support from a keyworker / adult as required, based on identified needs.
- Booster sessions for targeted PPG pupils in Year 6 (autumn and spring) and Year 5 (summer)
- 1:1 quality feedback given to PPG children to improve and extend their learning
- SEND Coordinator to provide additional support throughout the school, particularly for PPG children who also have special educational needs
- Deputy Headteacher to support teaching and learning for PPG pupils
- Staff training enabling teachers/teaching assistants to provide quality first teaching at all times
- Nurture provision for PPG pupils who would benefit from such support
- Trained TA to provide social, emotional and behavioural support such as 1:1 work and social skills activities/programme
- Additional phonics, reading, spelling and maths resources to be purchased for the benefit of PPG children
- Financial support for trips, residential visits and extra-curricular activities for families of PPG pupils where it is needed
- To run coffee mornings and / or parent/carer workshops/information sessions in the evening to support learning at home including e-Safety. Input from other agencies/professionals will be sought where appropriate. Specific parents/carers will be targeted and encouraged to attend these sessions.
- To supplement the curriculum with off site and on site learning opportunities offering support for PPG families who are unable to contribute financially (as appropriate)
- To provide uniform and equipment to families in need
- Providing additional resources to parents/carers to enable them to support their child at home, e.g. photocopied worksheets, activity ideas, etc.
- Fund access to After School Club, Breakfast Club and/or Holiday Club for specific pupils in receipt of PPG
- Mindfulness work undertaken with identified PPG pupils by trained Teaching Assistants
