Next Week in English

Year 3

Next week in English we will be learning our new story called Stone Age Boy. Our focus is on creating settings, so we will be looking at adjectives, powerful verbs and similes. As our story is set in the Stone Age there will be cross curricular work, linked particularly to our history but also our science.

Year 4

Year 4 are learning their new story 'The Door' next week. We will be using our imagination, alongside extracts from other portal stories to create a collection of words and ideas. We will be learning what authorial techniques are used to create such stories and to support this we will be reading the The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.

Year 5

Year 5 in English, will be learning a new text - Finding Tom - about a young girl looking for her older brother who has been evacuated from London. The children will be exploring the use of dialogue and narration in the story.

Year 6

Next week in Year 6, we will be learning The Caravan by Pie Corbett. We will be looking at the story in detail to understand how the different parts of the story have been put together (cohesion) and why we think the author made the literary choices he made. At the end of the week we will be writing a description of a given abandoned setting.

Next Week in Maths

Year 3

Next week, we will be learning to use the formal method to subtract. We will look at subtracting with and without regrouping, and then shall progress onto solving missing number subtraction problems.

Year 4

Next week, Year 4 will be learning to solve addition and subtraction problems involving measures. We will be learning to link multiplication and division on the bar model and rearrange multiplication and division models and word problems.

Year 5

In Year 5 maths, we will be looking at formal and mental methods of addition and subtraction and identifying strategies to help us with this.

Year 6

Next week, the children will be learning to add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions.
