## Next Week in English

### Year 3

Next week in English, we will be inventing our own portal stories where the characters travel to another land. We will continue our focus on setting descriptions using the techniques we have been learning.

### Year 4

Year 4 are learning to include effective dialogue in order to move their stories on. They are learning to include correct punctuation for speech, as well as using adverbial clauses in dialogue.

### Year 5

Year 5 are going to be writing their own journey stories, using the techniques learnt this week. We are looking forward to hearing their ideas.

### Year 6

Next week in English, we will be creating our own warning stories. This will build on the descriptive language and dialogue work we focussed on this week.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

Next week, we will be solving problems including missing number problems using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction.

### Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to multiply and divide by 10 and 100, investigating and understanding the effect of this and learning to represent this using decimal and fraction notation.

### Year 5

In Year 5 next week we will be looking at adjusting minuends and subtrahends to help us solve subtraction calculations mentally and find the difference.

### Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be learning to find the equivalent decimals to given fractions. This will then extend to percentages by the end of the week. In addition to this, we will also be learning how division is associated with fractions.
