THREADWORMS **NHS choices** Your health, your choices
You can buy medicine for threadworms from pharmacies. This is usually a chewable tablet or liquid you swallow. Treat everyone in your household, even if they don't have symptoms. Tell the pharmacist if you need to treat a child under 2, or if you're pregnant or breastfeeding. Treatment might not be suitable and you may need to speak to your GP.
You don't need to stay off school, nursery or work with threadworms.
