As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in the areas of participation, competition, workforce and clubs.

**Participation**  
All pupils in KS2 took part in some extra-curricular sporting event through the year, some children attending many clubs and some attending fewer. This equates to a 121% uptake in extra-curricular participation.  
23% of pupils lead, managed and officiated at different events.
