### MATHS WEEK – 'BUILDING OUR MATHS!'

We have had a superb first week back with a variety of exciting, enriching and challenging maths activities and investigations. The week started with the whole school investigating how large the giant must have been who left the footprint in the playground! Building upon that we have had maths trails using the whole school environment; class investigations; and exploration of maths found in other areas of the curriculum. The children across

the school have linked their maths and art to create some wonderful display work. We had an excellent enrichment day learning about 2D and 3D shapes and using nets led by Matthew Donald using Magformers. An Interhouse Maths Challenge with a special 'beat the teacher' round was held for the Juniors with eight teams competing. The winning house overall for this was Shergar who were represented by Harley, Oliver, Isabella, Cameron, Casius, Scarlett, Vincent, Aidan, Harry and Finton. A big well done to all those who participated. Many thanks also to parents, Governors and former pupils who have come in to talk about maths in their lives and supported the events of the week, as well as the staff who have put much time and thought into planning engaging and challenging activities.



### MATHS PARENTAL WORKSHOP

We will be holding a maths information session on **Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> January 5.30pm – 7pm**. We will begin in the hall with an overview of whole school changes to how maths is taught at the Vale, followed by workshops led by class teachers in classrooms that are age group specific and outline the progression in calculations; the use of concrete resources, pictorial representations and abstract methods; and illustrate an overview of the expectations in maths for each year group. There will be a crèche available for younger siblings in the school library. Please do support us in helping you support your children.



## POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

This week we have introduced some new positive behaviour expectations about conducting ourselves around school. Your children may come home talking about the smart 'Vale walk' to assembly – you could ask them to demonstrate!

We have also introduced 'Recognition' boards in each class. This is a collaborative approach to demonstrating learning behaviours. The class will have a target behaviour that is being worked on and 'looked for' by the teacher e.g. To take turns and have one voice sharing ideas in a group at a time. The aim is that each child in the class will have their name written up on the board when they have demonstrated this positive behaviour. The whole class can feel proud when each child's name has been displayed. The targets will be changed frequently.

## HEADTEACHER'S HOT CHOCOLATE!

As a school we would like to recognise further those children who go above and beyond the expected, by introducing the Headteacher's Friday Hot Chocolate. This will be a reward for one child in each class weekly who has been recognised for being an excellent role model. Class teachers will decide on a weekly basis who this will be and those pupils will be invited to enjoy a Hot Chocolate and a chat with Mrs Browne after playtime on a Friday morning.

## UNIFORM

With the beginning of the new term, please ensure your children have the correct uniform for school. It is important that the children wear school shoes and have smart presentation to show their readiness for learning.
