The government introduced an allocation of funding, in September 2011, to pupils in receipt of free school meals (FSM), those who have been looked after by the Local Authority for more than six months and the children of armed forces personnel. The aim of this funding is to support pupils with specific individual needs that will raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and to close the gap between them and their peers.

Since April 2014 an additional grant, pupil premium + (PP+) has been available to pupils who have been adopted from care.

It is the responsibility of all stakeholders, including the Governing Body of the school to be confident that the money has been used to assist these learners in “attaining and making the best progress possible across their learning.”

We have made focused provision for the pupils eligible for this funding at our school.

We are committed to ensuring positive and improving outcomes towards closing the gap between PP pupils and others in the cohort. We also want to ensure pupils work within the expected standard and reach ‘National Expectations’ by the end of Year 6.

Following discussion with SLT, our SENCO and class teachers we allocate funding to support pupil premium pupils in the following ways:

- 1-2-1 tuition
- Teacher led, before school interventions
- SENCO support for individual pupils and families
- Counselling
- Additional LSA support through intervention groups
- Curriculum resources
- Focused social and emotional group or individual support
- An offer of subsidy for breakfast club
- An offer of subsidy for after school club
- An offer of subsidy for residential trips
