
Children's Champion

Newsletters

Following parent feedback we have decided to send out printed copies of diary dates at the start of each term and to put a newsletter on our website at the end of each term to update you on all the lovely things your children have been doing.

Safety

We are experiencing a number of complaints from local residents about how parents park in the roads at the beginning and end of the day. Can we ask that you all park respectfully and avoid the yellow lines and roundabout?

Reminder: No bikes or scooters should be ridden on across either school site.

Gates

Please, please, please can you close all gates behind you if you are coming into the school grounds?

Our children's safety is paramount.

School Attendance

Regular and punctual attendance is essential if students are to make the best of all the educational opportunities offered by the school. We know that there are some occasions when your child being absent from school is unavoidable and children who are unwell should obviously stay at home, but their absence should be reported to the office each day that they not at school, and a reason given for their absence.

In certain circumstances to ensure that our registers are accurate and comply with Government guidelines the school may request medical evidence of a child's absence. This may apply to extended periods of absence, or periods of absence immediately prior to, or after, an official school holiday.

Wherever possible, medical /dental /optical appointments should be made outside of school time. If this is unavoidable a copy of the appointment letter should be given to the school office. Children should leave school as close to the appointment time as possible and return to school immediately following the appointment.

As you will be aware school attendance is monitored very closely across the Federation. If your child's attendance falls below 95%, as a school we are obliged to inform you, even though you may have already informed the school of a valid reason for their absence.

Lates

This term we have seen the number of lates double at the Infant School! 53 hours of learning time have been missed and 171 learning sessions interrupted by children arriving late. Please arrive on time or speak to Tracey Jackson our children's champion or Mrs Dance Head of School if you need support.

Flu - We have been asked to circulate the following information to parents

"In view of the increased cases of Flu this year, NHS England have taken the decision to extend the vaccination programme and make more vaccine available. Therefore there will be unexpected extended opportunities for your child to be vaccinated in community clinics; this is for those who have not already been vaccinated and are in the eligible cohort Year R, 1, 2, 3 or 4. This is regardless of whether you filled in a negative consent form in the first instance.

If you would like to take up this opportunity please contact the immunisation team on: 0333 234 1125 to book into a community clinic. Please note that this will be offered in first come/first serve basis until vaccine has run out, therefore early contact is advised."



Opticians check-ups

Did you know it's recommended that children have regular eye tests at least once every two years? These tests can be done at a high street opticians and are free for all children under 16 years old (and those under 19 years old in full-time education).
