Entry requirements for the course

To access this course you will need to be over 19 or older as of 31st August 2017, be a citizen of the EEA and have been resident in the EEA at least 3 years (NB a number of exemptions also apply, if you are not an EEA citizen please contact us to check your eligibility).

It is an option to bring young people with you, but any young people attending must attend with a parent/carer. The course is also open to parent / carers on their own.

If you have additional learning needs

You can discuss this with your tutor ideally before the course on the first day so that they can work with you to identify what additional support you need. You can also identify your needs on your application form in advance.

What can I expect to get out of the course

- Gain a greater understanding of social media concerns including sexting, cyberbullying, online grooming.
- Know how to use parental controls and privacy settings.
- Be able to identify possible warning signs – when should you be concerned?
- Know where you can go for more help
- Understand what is healthy SMART use of IT / social media
