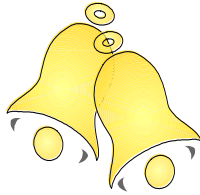

## Family Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling workshop

This was held in school on 15<sup>th</sup> February and 37 families took part, finding out what children now have to learn in junior school as part of the curriculum! It was a great workshop in which parents and carers came to realise just how difficult some of the work is that children have to learn. Thanks for the great feedback from those that attended, including:

*'This workshop will help me help my child at home'; 'I now realise how comprehensive our children need understand grammar, punctuation and spelling'; 'Very helpful - thank you'; 'I now realise how hard GPS is now for our children!'; 'Thank you for the opportunity to see what my children are learning and do a worksheet with my daughter'; 'Can we have more 'Parent lessons'; 'Very helpful - thanks!'*

We will be doing more workshops for families - keep an eye out for letters for next term!



**We do feel it is important to give our children as many experiences as possible to support their learning and in preparation for independent life as they get older. The trips we arrange are always with the idea to get best value, not only money wise, but educational (& fun) wise. The school supports a lot of trips and does not ask for contributions for swimming (which currently costs us £7500 a year) or sporting competition travel (costing us £2000 a year) or visitors/ experts into school (costing us up to £6000 a year). With reductions in budgets this year and next (& with increased costs into school) we are struggling to provide these kind of activities and visits. Although payments for trips/ visits is voluntary and we never stop a child from going for non-payment, we cannot keep continuing to fund these extra activities and trips without your support in paying for them – and therefore these could reduce or be cancelled if the school cannot afford these. This would be a shame as the children, when we have pupil conversations, always highlight trips and visitors as something they really enjoy. Thank you, as always, for your support.**
