Lent—A time to examine our lives, to make Lenten promises and to make a fresh start.

The colour purple dominates our prayer corners and focal points as this is the colour associated with this season. Purple represents a time of preparation and repentance. Lent lasts for six weeks and is the 40 days before Easter in the Christian calendar. It is a time of disciplined preparation for the great celebration of Easter—a time for getting spiritually fit. It is a time to stop and take stock of life and to make resolutions to do better in future. Many Christians try to do something special during Lent. This might be something extra or spending more time in prayer, or it might be giving something up (cakes or chocolate, for example) as an act of self-denial and discipline, and giving the money saved to a charity. 
Attendance
