## Next Week in English

### Year 3

Next week, Year 3 will begin a new non-fiction unit which focuses on techniques we can use to persuade. We will be learning a persuasive letter linked to our fiction story.

### Year 4

In English next week, Year 4 will be continuing their work on writing suspense and action. Pupils will be creating their own stories using techniques learnt previously in the unit.

### Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been writing their warning stories. They are going to be improving part of the story at the start of next week as well as learning a new text.

### Year 6

Next week in English, we will be changing our focus from Talk for Writing, to reading. We will be working as a whole class, groups and individuals to investigate different texts and answer SAT style questions on them. We look forward to working with the children on their reading skills.

## Next Week in Maths

### Year 3

Next week, we will be interpreting and presenting data using bar charts, pictograms and tables. This will involve making links between bar charts and pictograms and completing and finding information from pictograms.

### Year 4

Year 4 will be learning to interpret discrete and continuous data. We will be learning to choose the best way to present it. We will be revising the properties of shape with a strong vocabulary focus. We will learn to classify and draw quadrilaterals

### Year 5

In Year 5 next week, we will be adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator and fractions with denominators that have a common multiple. We will also be looking at reflection and translation.

### Year 6

Next week in maths, the children will be continuing to learn about reflection and translation. They will be plotting coordinates in the 4 quadrants and translating shapes.

Key vocabulary: quadrant, reflection, translation, axes, origin, negative, positive, horizontal, vertical and coordinates
