I have lived in Broughton for the past 17 years and work as an Anaesthetic nurse in the local hospital. I have been a nurse for 28 years and have worked in many hospitals around the country.

Latterly, she was a wonderful supporter of our school community in her role as grandma of Anya in Year 5, attending everything that took place in school and we will miss her greatly. Her funeral is to be held in Dearham Methodist Church this Thursday March 22nd at 1.00pm.
